
# The GeoPal Driver App – Sample screens from actual ZeroNet deployment




Dynamic pick-up list reflects items created in portal and entered by user

Are optional steps



Collection process can be tightly controlled



Any items recovered can be barcoded e.g. data bearing WEEE





## Stirling Trial – March 2019

### ZeroNet Stirling trial - Overview



- Took place on 23rd March 'Family and Friends' approach with support from local consultants Enscape
- 78 People approached/23 signed up (30% rate)
- All 23 participated in collection event on evening of 23<sup>rd</sup>
- No advertising was done word of mouth produced very high 'hit rate' (target was 25 households)
- Householder was very positive see sample comments on next slide



### ZeroNet Stirling trial - Comments

"My experience with the recycling guys was positive. They were on time, cheery and helpful. The one thing I'd like to have is some kind of audit or trail to be able to follow the stuff to its eventual destination. I'd recommend others to use it if I had more details of that sort. It was very cathartic getting rid of all those cables, though."

"......Happy that charities are involved – much easier than having to donate in city centre where parking is difficult"



### ZeroNet Stirling trial - Learnings








 'Face to face' collection critical for secure handling of data bearing IT



 Secure destruction of data bearing IT was critical too – feedback via the app a big plus



- Charity and reuse organisations' involvement is key
- Items recovered mainly clothing were generally in v good condition and suitable for reuse



Density and multiple transactions per household is key to a profitable service



## Stirling 2020?





Creating a model Circular City

### Stirling 2020 – The Plan



- Scale the project to be available in all homes in city – c. 13k
- Trial regular existing collection services inc. WEEE, textiles, kids toys, books etc
- Partner with reuse and charity sector
- Augment existing portfolio, possibly to include bio-waste recovery: e.g.
  - Food waste, coffee grinds, pods
  - Reverse supply chain sectoral or branded partners
- Consider a 'Closed loop' retail model, or DRS trial
